WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF AN AUTOMATIC LITTER BOX?

First off, your cat(s) will do MUCH better if they have a clean litter box. That usually means scooping it at least 4 times a day. You need one more litter box than you have cats—so 2 for one cat, 3 for two cats, etc. Now you know why we have so many. If you work or just like everybody else, have a busy life that you don't want to be a servant to your cat's litter box, an automatic litter box is awesome! Some that we have used in the past are:



An automatic litter box waits a given time after being used, then cycles it, cleaning the litter. Most have an app that notifies you when it needs to be emptied. I love that. I don't have to think about it much. Some let you know when it needs more litter. Some breeder will never use an automatic litter box because of potential dangers. I've been using them for over 4 years and until now, I haven't had any problems. Your kitten must be at least 5 pounds before allowing it to be in automatic mode. Before then, **PLEASE put it in manual mode and cycle it often. To protect your kitten.**

My daughter has a Petkit. A friend had the smaller one that was flat on top and you could put things on it. My daughter has the one that rolls. The waste bag is fairly small and needs to be replaced more often. I would recommend that one, as well.



We have 5 Litter Robots in our home—Four of them are Litter Robot 3's and one 4. I do like the 4, and they just came out with a Litter Hopper. It holds 15 cups of litter that will be deposited into the Litter Robot 4 as the litter gets low. They work pretty well and aren't too difficult to clean. I had a LalaHome litter box. It's pretty heavy. It was fairly easy to clean, and a cool feature was that there was a place in the top that held 5 litter refills, adding litter when it was low. It's made in China and has an app. Sometimes I struggled with the buttons on the litter box, getting it to do what I wanted it to do. If you don't get the litter pans all the way clicked in, it can leak, especially if you have a high sprayer. I don't have that one any more.



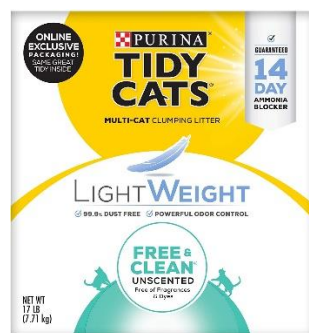
I purchased a Popur for my bathroom because a breeder said it was great and safe with kittens. I loved it till recently when I went into the bathroom and found a kitten had its leg stuck in it from the outside of the litter box, as it closed. Luckily, I had not been gone long he had a full recovery within a couple days. That was an injury that could happen with any cat, not just a kitten. I now leave that in manual mode and I have to manually cycle it four times a day, with me in the bathroom so I can make sure there aren't any cats by it. I liked it pretty well, but now I wouldn't recommend it.
